



HOW TO JOIN PATRIOTIC SOCIETIES

Not everyone will agree that membership in a Patriotic Society is a good thing. I would like to encourage and persuade Arkansas people to join some of the societies presented in this article. I believe that membership in one of these will make you a better citizen and make you have pride in your family and the heritage of our country. Not everyone will agree on which of these societies is the best one to join. The answer of most people will depend on which of the societies they belong to, or are eligible to join as a member. All of these societies have high objectives and can inspire a person to serve our country in ways that can make our democracy stronger and give to our future generations a better way of life.

Arkansas has some people who are eligible for membership in all of these societies. Several of these societies are organized on a state basis in Arkansas. Others are organized on a regional or local basis.

Daughters of the American Revolution is a strong and aggressive state organization in Arkansas. This group is known commonly as DAR. The present State Regent is Mrs. James A. Williams of Parkdale. State officers serving with Mrs. Williams are: Mrs. Thomas F. Dodson of Little Rock, vice regent; Mrs. George Yost of Prairie Grove, chaplain; Mrs. Bernard M. Brazil of Dermott, recording secretary; Mrs. Carl Dean Miller of Parkdale, corresponding secretary; Mrs. W. Mason Murphy of Little Rock, treasurer; Mrs. Ralph O. Mott of Fort Smith, registrar; Mrs. Herman Platz of Hot Springs, Historian, and Mrs. Paul H. Harrison of Osceola, librarian. Mrs. W. P. Cook of Little Rock is organizing secretary and Mrs. Winslow C. Spousta of Rogers, parliamentarian. Membership is strictly researched and "Any woman is eligible for membership in this Society who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor or a civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided she is personally acceptable to the Society."

Sons of the American Revolution is at the present time developing its membership and strengthening its organization. Membership in this great organization is carefully researched and "Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over and a citizen in good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unflinching in loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States; or as a Signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain."

Many prominent Arkansans have been leaders in the S. A. R. State organization. Here are the names of a few who will gladly help you in joining this fine society: Edward L. Westbrooke of Jonesboro; Thomas M. Robinson of Jonesboro; Joe N. Basore of Cherokee Village; James S. Upton of Conway; and William M. Bruce, Jr., William E. Snodgrass, Pat C. Herington, Jerome T. Thompson, Ulrich R. Beeson, Kenneth Johnson, Ira L. Corn, Alexander S. Smith, Henry Moore and Robert Davis Lee, all of Little Rock. Winthrop Rockefeller of

Little Rock is active in the national organization. In the Arkansas Society the most important leader is Robert S. W. Walker of Mountain Home. In addition to being the moving personality in the state society, Mr. Walker is a National Trustee.

The United States Daughters of 1812 has just recently held its state meeting in Pine Bluff. Its membership is carefully researched and "Any white woman may be eligible to membership in this Society who is above the age of 18 years and whose lineal ancestors served in the Army or Navy or Civil Government of the United States during the 31 years which followed the close of the War of the American Revolution, or gave material aid to their country, provided such applicant be acceptable to the Chapter."

The Arkansas chapter is known as the General George Izard Chapter and the state officers are as follows: Mrs. J. Fred Hilton of Pine Bluff, president; Mrs. Elliott, vice-president; Mrs. John C. Webkes, second vice-president; Mrs. Girault, chaplain; Miss Combs, acting secretary; Mrs. J. Curtis Mead, historian; Miss Virginia Mills, corresponding secretary; Mrs. Alan R. Russell, treasurer; Mrs. Mathis, curator; and Mrs. Carl Rickman, parliamentarian.

There is a strong movement in the state known as the United Daughters of the Confederacy or U.D.C. "Those eligible to membership are the wives, mothers, sisters, nieces, grand-nieces, and lineal descendants of such men who served honorably in the Confederate Army, Navy, or Civil Service."

The State has a good organization of men who are interested in the Confederate States heritage and these men are known as Sons of the Confederacy. Those eligible to membership are the sons, nephews, grand-nephews and other lineal descendants of such men who served honorably in the Confederate Army, Navy or Civil Service.

The Mayflower Society has a state organization in Arkansas. A state leader is Mrs. W. W. Simpson of 607 East Sixth Street, Little Rock. "Every direct descendant of any passenger on the Mayflower on the voyage which terminated at Plymouth, New England, in December, 1620, shall be eligible for membership in this Society."

Other Patriotic Societies which Arkansas citizens should consider are: Sons and Daughters of the Pilgrims, Daughters of the American Colonists, National Society Magna Charta Dames, National Society Daughters of Colonial Wars, Colonial Dames of the XVIIth Century, Daughters of Founders and Patriots of America, Daughters of the Republic of Texas, Huguenot Society, Colonial Dames, National Society of Women Descendants of Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company, National Society of New England Women, Daughters of Colonial War, Daughters of the Cincinnati, Descendants of the Colonial Clergy, and Descendants of the Signers of the Declaration of Independence.

For the sake of future families who will make Family History in Arkansas, I hope you will join some of these great societies and encourage others in your family and your friends to do the same.

SAMUEL FILLENGIM

(ED. NOTE: Mrs. Hill explained to us that the spelling of this family name varied widely and she copied it from the various records as it was spelled. The spelling in the title is the way she believes to be correct.)

It was a long time ago that Samuel Fillighan, an Irishman, waded into the then unexplored wilderness of Eastern Arkansas. It was in 1798, during the reign of Spain in these parts, that this Irishman was granted a tract of land by the crown. What is now Cross County on the banks of a little creek (now known as Cooper's Creek) and near the nearly vanished old settlement called Wittsburg was the scene of this land grant.

Little did Samuel Fillengim dream when he waded into that wilderness and felled the trees to build his modest home that he was writing his name indelibly into the pages of the history of a state that had not then been created. Such is the case, however, because he was the first white settler in what is now Cross County, Arkansas. The story of that county can never be recited comprehensively and correctly without reference to the name of Samuel Fillingham. ¹

Samuel Filligan purchased Spanish land grant #498 from William Russell of St. Louis. Benjamin Fooy of Fooy's Point was his nearest neighbor. ² He helped select the site on the St. Francis River (about 10 miles below Strong's) and laid off the town of Franklin (on the site of an old Cherokee village). ³ The list of the Seventh Territorial Legislature shows St. Francis and Monroe counties represented by S. W. Calvert and Samuel Fillingim. ⁴

Three early families, all related, were those of Samuel Filligen, Tyer and William Strong. Samuel Filligen settled near old Wittsburg in what is now Cross County, in 1798, and later moved into what is now Johnson township in St. Francis County. ⁵

From Samuel Tyer, grandson of Samuel Filligin, I got the following information:

"In 1815, Samuel Filligin, with his own family and his son-in-law, Wright Tyer, and his sons Samuel and Ajax Tyer and daughters Sallie and Macey Tyer moved from East Tennessee to Cape Girardeau, Missouri. In 1816 Filligin and Tyer left their families at Cape Girardeau and came down to what was then Arkansas County, in Missouri Territory, and made a crop on what is now part of Sec.26, T 8 N, R3 E, one mile east of what was later Pineville. The next year they brought their families and became permanent settlers. Ajax Tyer died near Hydrick in Cross County in 1866. Samuel Tyer died three miles north of Wynne in 1890, within six miles of where he settled 74 years earlier. Macey Tyer and Sally Tyer each married a brother of Mark W. Izard, President of Second Arkansas State Senate and later Governor of Nebraska Territory. Wright Tyer died in 1831." ⁶

The 1830 census of St. Francis County, Arkansas, lists Samuel Filligen in Franklin twp., 18 in household, including two slaves, and Sarah Filligen in Franklin twp., one in household.

Samuel Fillengim died March 4, 1834, and is supposedly buried in an almost forgotten cemetery on Highway #64, between Wynne and Levesque, Arkansas. ⁷

Since "Dovey" Filligen paid taxes on land in 1834 that Samuel had owned in 1833, we presume his wife's name to have been "Dovey". Taxes on this same land was later paid by Jonathan, Samuel and V. C. Filligen. We therefore presume these three to have been sons of Samuel Filligen, Sr. In 1848 Samuel H. Fillingen and the firm of Fillingen and Strong are listed as non-resident owners of this same land.

Dudley Williams Fillingim is listed in the 1850 census as 32 years old and in the 1860 census as 42 years old. Both this 1850 and 1860 census were of Ozark, White Oak twp. Dudley Williams Fillingim is also listed in the 1880 census of Prairie Co. as 63 years of age.

Jarvis, 21 years; his wife, Elizabeth, 19 years; and Samuel, 22 years; all born in Arkansas, are mentioned in the 1850 census.

We know that Sarah Jane Fillingen, born 1820, in Arkansas, married John Huggins Reid, who was born in Ireland in 1804, died 188?, Brockwell, Arkansas, buried in Owens Cemetery in an unmarked grave.

The 1850 census of Independence County, Arkansas, shows #761, Christian twp.: John H. Reid, 46, farmer; Sarah, 30, born Ark.; Wm. A., 8; Dudley W., 3; Sarah J., 1; and Cenia Mullins, 10. Later children were: Sam, Celia (married 1st Reid, 2nd Jones), Bob and Mary (married Dan McAnally, Franklin, Arkansas).⁸ All children were born in Arkansas. Sarah J. married Rev. Jno. Watson, Thayer, Mo.

Rev. Dudley Williams Reid, born Dec. 27, 1847, Independence Co., Ark., son of John Huggins Reid and Sarah Jane (Fillingen) Reid, m. Harriett Ann Parsons, daughter of Thomas Thompson Parsons and Mary Francis (Clardy) Parsons. Harriett was born in Bedford Co., Tenn., July 13, 1855, married Dec. 16, 1869 at Mill Creek, Sharp Co., Ark. Their children:

The last will of John Fillingham, Sen. of Pitt Co., North Carolina, signed Nov. 11, 1771, and executed Dec. 22, 1773, lists his wife, Margaret, five sons, John, Robert, Samuel, Jarvis and Benjamin, and two daughters, Mary Hays and Mathew White.

A Short History and Membership List of

BETHEL MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH, GLENWOOD, ARKANSAS
1848 - 1875by

Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, now located at Glenwood, Arkansas, was organized on August 5, 1848, with seven charter members, at the home of Deacon William F. Browning, two miles northeast of the present site of Amith, Arkansas. These three brothers and four sisters were: William F. Browning; his wife, Mary L. (Burk) Browning; William Tucker; Jesse Cunningham; Frances Maynard (or Mainor); Nancy Fooshe; and Mary C. Browning. Elders William Hardage and William L. Anderson were the officials who oversaw the organization.

The church was first named Caddo Valley Baptist Church of Christ and met in the home of Browning until August, 1850, when the church voted to build a meeting-house, and agreed to be known as the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church of Christ. This building, built of split logs at a cost of \$225. by William F. Browning, was located at or near the site of the present Buck Sloan residence southeast of Glenwood.

Here is the report of the building committee submitted on August 31, 1850: "Pleasant Grove Meeting House (committee) made the following report. (viz.) We the ... committee being appointed by Pleasant Grove Baptist Church, having had the same under consideration, do find that the said meeting house was built by the Baptist denomination and by individuals friendly to the Baptist cause, and find by the subscription only \$2.00 bussed by the Methodist, and more over do find by the subscribed there is not the amount subscribed on the subscription that was to be paid for building said house, and further more do find that several of the persons that subscribed have left the country, and we do thank that Brother William F. Browning, the builder that was to get \$225. . . said house was built agreeable to said contract, that the Church ... should endeavor to make up what is lacking for building said house."

The Church retained this name until April, 1861, when it was changed to the Bethel Missionary Baptist Church--a name it has maintained until the present. It is one of the very few Arkansas churches that managed to maintain its services throughout the disruptions of the Civil War. One entry in the record book reads: "Saturday, April 2nd, 1864. No conference because of the troubles of the war. J. Neighbors, Church Clerk." The occasion for these troubles was Steel's Red River Expedition into southern and southwestern Arkansas in the summer of 1864. Another entry a few months later refers to other troubles: "Sat. December 31th, 1864, being Saturday before the first Sabbath in January, 1865. No conference because of smallpox and burying the Dead. J. Neighbors, Church Clerk."

The Church was represented at the 1848 session of the Saline Regular Baptist Association, and sent delegates to the organizational meeting of Red River Baptist Association "... to meet at Mt. Zion Church, Hempstead County", also in 1848. Pleasant Grove Church (Bethel) continued in this Association until the fall of 1853 when she, along with the Big Fork Church, Polk County, the Liberty Church and the Mt. Gillead Church, both of Montgomery County, and the Phillippi Church of Clark County helped organize the Caddo River Missionary Baptist Association on October 8-10, 1853 at the Mt. Gillead Church, which is now west of Norman, Ark.

In 1867, it was Bethel Church which called for the reorganization of this Missionary Baptist Association after it had ceased meeting during the Civil War. The Church remained in this Association until 1902 when she became a charter member of the Pike County Missionary

Baptist Association, now known as the Clark-Pike Baptist Association. The Church has also been an active supporter of the activities of the American Baptist Association, the nation's largest Landmark Baptist organization, in recent years.

The Church located at its present site, just east of the city of Glenwood on the Steve Baker Road, in 1876. About six acres were deeded to the Church for a building site and a cemetery. Several frame buildings were constructed at or near the present brick and block church-plant, which was constructed in 1950, with an annex added in 1965. Elder Earl Bardwell is the present pastor.

Bethel Church is the oldest Missionary Baptist Church, which is now active, in western Arkansas. It is the mother of all Baptist churches in the upper Caddo River Valley and has served its community and membership with spiritual instruction and community leadership faithfully since 1848.

A partial list of the ministers who have served the Church would include the following until 1870:

Membership ranged from the seven original members to a near high of 82 in 1869 to the present membership of about 70. Here is a membership list of Bethel Baptist Church from 1848 until 1875, compiled from the first two record books. The first book is so badly torn that several business meetings are missing, and therefore the list is somewhat incomplete.

I have run across Ashbys in Ark. census records as being born in S. C. and N. C., and I am interested in knowing if anyone has proved the link between Thomas and a John Ashby of Quenby, S. C. (ca 1670). Some sources say that the first wife of Thomas was a Woodruff, and the wife named in his will was Rose ---, but according to the will, she was not the mother of all his children. This family intermarried with Van Meters, Hites, Howells, Lewises, etc.

I am seeking information on David E. (prob. Ephraim) Young, who moved to Little Rock 1873-78, and who is listed in the 1880 census with Winnie, his second wife, and child Dolly.
