



Unfortunately, this member made no provisions for the disposal of this material after her death. Through a number of circumstances, this invaluable material was destroyed. When questioned about it, her family expressed much surprise that anyone would be interested in grandmother's old papers. They reasoned that since she had made no provisions during her lifetime, the material must have little value.

This is but one of many similar incidents. If you have valuable, to you, family history data, please express in a WILL or to members of your family, your wishes about its permanent preservation. The ideal solution would be placing it in your state archives or with your state historical society. Your local college or university library might also wish to take this material. Local public libraries are very interested in material relating to local families. Your state archives might like to microfilm this material, thus further insuring its preservation. As an added advantage, most material given to a public institution as a gift can be taken off your state and federal income taxes. Please make provisions for your material before it is too late.

Again this leaves many QUERIES in our waiting stack...however remember they are published without charge, just need to wait for SPACE! Of course we all agree, the Cemetery and Bible Records (which are so hard to get in the first place, but when they are given to us, without any trouble...except to open the mail) and are of such great value (not just for the present, but for many years). We do really appreciate these, and our many thanks to all of those who share in all the trips to the cemeteries (very few cemeteries are inventoried in only one trip). I would like for every one to use the "buddy-system" and inventory just one cemetery! The of course type it and share it with another researcher. But wait that is not all...you might also read census for a few hours (copy some of it, of course)...and while you are there...try reading a few months of old newspaper (on microfilm). I could list several other time consuming chores if you are not completely out of energy by that time!

TIME TO RENEW!

Now is not too early to send your renewal fee of \$9. to Ms. Hubbard, Membership Chairman, Rt. 6 Box 238, Hot Springs, AR 71901. Postal fees are due to rise again, but if your membership is already paid, you will be lucky. We have really had a better year in 1980 with so many renewals coming in before the deadline. As everyone knows by this time, your Editor is only one person, and lives in the same house (our headquarters) and much much mail arrives every day, even with the weather so very hot, and soon it will be very cold (no matter...the mail still comes!) There is just no way to guess how many members be might have as a TOTAL for the entire year. However if your renewal fee is already paid, before the press begins, you know you will receive your Quarterly. With the price of paper, ink, masters, and other supplies constantly on the increase, we need to watch every corner in the budget. In 1979 we ended the year in October, as the March and June issues were already out of print (and had been reprinted several times). I was able to find some of what he wanted. In the AFH, he also stated that he and his wife would check records at the Library in Shreveport for anyone wishing them to do so. Well, I 'took him up on it' and asked him to check the index to Passenger Lists. And guess what he found? Since he didn't find my people on the lists, he started checking census records and he had supplied me with a most important missing link in the family chain. He found the people I was searching for in 1860. I had thought they were in Louisiana, but had no idea where.

I just want everyone to know how much the AFH means to me, for without this valuable little book, I would never have been able to find these people or John Head, either.

Though, I have already thanked John for his research, I want to thank AFH and the staff for making this possible!"

BOOK REVIEWS - GIFT BOOKS GIVEN TO OUR ARKANSAS GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY'S LIBRARY
Reviews by Robert W. Dhonau

"CEMETERIES OF NORTH PANOLA COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI" - 1980, is a gift by one of our members, M. C. Terry of Little Rock. It is a publication by the Panola Historical and Genealogical Society. Mr. Terry had an active part in gathering the information about his home territory.

This is a well done record of graves in 16 public cemeteries and some twenty-odd private cemeteries. This is the second such publication of this group, the first in 1977 was of the Batesville, Mississippi Cemetery. That place is the county seat of North Panola County. Last names are capitalized for easy location & reading.

The index is alphabetical and a scale map of the county follows with the location of each cemetery marked by a star and code letter. We appreciate the donation of this valuable record for our library. The book may be obtained for \$6.50 per copy from Mrs. Mary Jane Wilson, Box 365, Sardis, Mississippi 38666.

"MEMORIES, RECOLLECTIONS and REFLECTIONS" by William Thomas Buffaloe, Monette, Arkansas - 1958, is another donation we have received.

This is a reprint in 1979 of the story about the family of a Craighead County historian. He was born 26 June 1884 in that County. The family of his grandfather, William Addison Buffaloe, came from Alabama and the family of his grandmother, Tabitha Magers lived in Lincoln C., TN. They came to Arkansas about 1859.

This narrative tells the many events in the lives of the family and touches on many events of historical significance. It is told in a "folksy" manner. We appreciate the donation of this book to our AGS Library.

"THE FAMILY SEARCH of CLARENCE RICE OWENS" - 1975. Collected by Clarence R. Owens, compiled by Katharine Bruce Jones and published by California Genealogical Society, San Francisco, CA.

Twenty-five years of family research was left by Mr. Owens when he and his wife died in 1967 as result of injuries sustained in an auto accident. Their WILLS stipulated money for publishing this research.

Richard Owen, the immigrant to Maryland was born in Great Britain and married to Rachel----in 1682. He died in Maryland before 4 November 1716, when his wife gave bond as administratrix of his estate. His wife and children used the name of OWINGS. His descendants are traced on to North Carolina and Indiana, Missouri, Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, and several other states. This family history is well organized and documented. Family names most often mentioned are: Adams, Alexander, Berry, Chambers, Chapin, Choat, Corson, Crawford, Davison, Farnam, Johnson, Patterson, Rice, and Wiltse. We are grateful for this donation.

"I REMEMBER..." by Jennie Koons Steele, with letters to and from Richard St. Clair Steele, 1888 to 1907, and edited by Marion Devault Steele, 1977.

Jennie grew up on a farm in Northwestern Missouri in the 1870's. She went to high school in northwest Arkansas in the 1880's and studied music in Boston 1891-92 then taught school in Arkansas and Missouri.

From 1898 to 1906 after she married she lived at three Indian Agencies in Northern Oklahoma then from 1907 to 1918 lived there on a wheat farm and raised a family.

This information was obtained from letters written from 1947 to 1955 found in an old trunk. This story was then compiled from 1969 to 1977. It is a very human story and written with love and respect. It is generously documented with pictures of documents, maps and those of members of the family. It is a very welcome addition to our library and describes life in varied locales.

"NORTH AMERICAN IMMIGRATION TO BRAZIL" - Tombstone Records of the "Campo" Cemetery - Santa Barbara D'Oeste, Sao Paulo State, Brazil - 1978, by Betty Antunes DeOliveira and donated by the compiler.

This calls to mind the North American families who went to Brazil after the Civil War. It was against Brazilian law for non-Roman Catholics to be placed in the common official cemeteries. These people faced an uncertain future in a sister country. They were unafraid and planted the seed of good relationship in education, culture, faith and agriculture.

The alphabetical index is in the front. The inscriptions on the tombstones follow in the order of the graves in the cemetery. There are pictures of many of the tombstones and a map showing where the graves were located. We appreciate this valuable information. This book may be purchased for \$12.50 from Leonard J. "MARTIN TREET FAMILY" by Ted M. Miller, 53 Pepper Ferry Road, Radford, Virginia 24141

This is a family history about the descendants of Martin Treet, born 1845 in Alabama and his parents had come from North Carolina. About 1879 he moved his family to Boone Co., Arkansas, and his brother, Jim, moved his family south of Little Rock, Arkansas.

This genealogical work was written with a section for corrections and additions. It is planned that new material will be written later. There is a listing of over 400 names in 71 families. Thanks for this donation to our AGS Library.

CEMETERY RECORDS OF INDEPENDENCE COUNTY, ARKANSAS, by Chalmers E. Green and Mae Chinn Green. Published in 1980 by Morgan Books, 314 Vine Street, Newport, Arkansas 72112. Hardcover 8 1/2 X 11 with 478 pages including maps and indexes. \$27.00 postpaid.

This monumental collection of inventories from all known cemeteries in Independence County was compiled by Mr. and Mrs. Green from 1975 through 1977. They used various types of maps to locate many of the graveyards. The locations of others were solicited via notices in local newspapers and on local radio stations. The field notes for each cemetery have been transcribed as inventoried in an effort to preserve family groupings.

This splendid book contains over 16,000 entries with an index of over 1,600 different surnames. Also within the pages of this book are maps of the various political townships within the county. The location of the cemeteries within each township is shown, and a brief sketch of each cemetery is given.

Genealogists, family historians and local historians will find this fine compilation to be an extremely useful reference book for Independence County. The earliest inscription is in 1821. Our thanks to Mr. & Mrs. Green for this Gift to our AGS Library.

This transcription contains all the information on the census except "those persons attending school within the year" and "those persons over 20 years of age that could not read or write". Census page and date of enumeration is given.

Schedule 2-Slave Inhabitants. There were 189 slaves with their owners enumerated. Mortality Schedules. These show 69 persons had died in the year preceding the taking of the census. Gives name, age, sex, where born, month of death, and cause of death.

"THE 1870 UNITED STATES CENSUS OF GREENE COUNTY, ARKANSAS", by Una Pollard (address same as above).

There were 1299 dwellings enumerated and 1339 heads of families with a listing of some 952 variations of family surnames. The statistics show a population of 7,417 with 157 of these being black. This transcription contains all the information given on the census except "those attending school within the year" and those "that could not read or write". The voting eligibility was also given on this census but is not recorded in this transcription. Persons married within the year have the month recorded and also the month of a child's birth under one year. The Ffb and Mfb means Father or Mother foreign born. The census page and date of enumeration are shown as well as the indication of personal affliction of some persons.

Mortality Schedules show 145 persons had died in the year preceding the taking of the census. Gives name, age, sex, color, where born, month of death, and cause of death.

Map of Ola business Places 1870-1930, several pages of pictures, mention of first school building, business houses, hotel, first homes, Dardanelle & Ola Railroad Company, Masonic Hall, School teachers, several historical events, including "Airplane landing in City Square". Yell County has not had much in print to this date, but several projects are working at present. TO HOPE, TO LABOR, AND SO TO LIVE—Descendants of John MACK (1740–1814)
With Some Allied Families by Mary P. Engels, 1024 Hicky, Forrest City,
Arkansas 72335

An historical marker near McCains, Tennessee, and the old Mack grave-
yard nearby states that John MACK was the first of his name in Tennessee.
John MACK's weathered gravestone shows he was born in Scotland in 1740 and
died in his 74th year in 1814. The stone of his "only wife", Sarah, alongside
shows she was born in Pennsylvania and died in her 83rd year.

The marriage bond of John MACK and Sarah BURNETT states they were
married in Prince Edward County, Virginia, 2 September 1766 during the reign
of King George III of England. This is the first legal record found for
John and Sarah MACK.

No proof has been found of a connection between this MACK family and
any other early MACKs. This is not the MACK line of Joseph Smith, the Mormon
leader.

John MACK lived in Pittsylvania County, VA., during the American Rev-
olution and served in the Virginia Militia. By 1790 he was living in Rocking-
ham County, North Carolina. Then he appears to have moved back to Virginia
by 1792, and from there he came to Middle Tennessee between 1805–1810.

Children of John MACK named in his will drawn up 31 May 1813 in Maury
County, Tennessee, were: James (1767), John, Jr. (1769), Mary "Polly" MURPHY
(ca. 1770), Robert (1772), William (1775), James Harvey (ca. 1778), Constantine
(ca. 1780), Sarah "Sally" NANCE (ca. 1782).

James MACK married Sarah WILSON in 1789 in North Carolina. The WILSON
line beginning with Rev. Thomas WILSON, Presbyterian minister from Ireland to
Somerset County, Maryland, in 1685, is traced through five generations to
Sarah, born 1767 in Maryland.

Aquilla Wilson MACK, son of James, married Serene HUDSON ca. 1822.
The McKNITT, BREVARD, REESE, POLK line of Serene HUDSON is traced back sev-
eral generations to the immigrant ancestors in Pennsylvania and Maryland.

Biographical sketches of all the children of John and Sarah BURNETT
MACK are given, along with 65 family charts of the descendants.

Shortly after 1850 there was an exodus of MACKs from Tennessee. Some
came to Greene and Independence Counties, Arkansas, while others moved to
Greene County, Missouri. After 1865 several families moved to northeastern
Texas. The MACK family was divided during the Civil War. Some fought and died
in the Union Army and some in the Confederate Army. Some were adamant radi-
cals while others were strong southern sympathizers.

Some families intermarried with the MACK family were: TAYLOR, CYPERT,
BURNS, GILBREATH, ROSS, JONES, ENGELS, MOORE, MASSEY, LINDSEY, BATEMAN, PARKS,
BLAIR, CROSTHWAIT, CAMPBELL, MATTHEWS, MURPHY, MORROW, BROWN, GARNER, RIEVES,
COOPER, HUDSPETH, WALL, BURNETT, NANCE.

Peter INGLES States that in the fall of 1814 he was drafted into the Company of Capt. Memorial Forest and Rendezvoused at Newport, Kentucky, about the 15th Sept. of said year. He further states that his company was attached to the 16th Regt. Ky. Ma. and was at first commanded by Col. A. Porter. He further states that after he left Newport, Ky., they marched to Urbana, Ohio, and remained there some eight to ten days. They then marched to Malden and took up winter quarters. He further states that whilst at Malden and in the actual service of the U.S. he was taken sick and was compelled to take a great deal of medicine, such as Tartar & other strong medicines. And being much exposed to the cold, having only a thin lincoun Tent and but few necessary articles of clothing, that during said sickness he frequently had the Cramp very bad, but worse in his legs than any other part, particularly in his right leg, which never did get well from that time but continued as he advanced in life to get worse. And at this time very much disables him from obtaining a livelihood by manual labor- that being the only way he has to support himself & family, he being in very moderate circumstances. He further states that before he was drafted and joined the army he enjoyed good health and never was afflicted with the cramp in his limbs, nor did he feel anything of it until after his sickness at Malden and the taking of medicine, as he has already stated. He states unequivocally that the situation of his legs originated from the aforesaid sickness and taking of medicine whilst at Malden in the winter of 1814-15. He further states that after said sickness he got so that he could go about and attend to his duty. He further states that about the 1st February 1815 he with others left Malden and went to Fort Geotiot where he staid until his time was out and received his discharge - Signed this 24th January 1835.

By satisfactory and accurate examination it appears that during the winter of 1814 & 15 whilst stationed at Malden in Upper Canada, he was sorely afflicted with Cramp in the right leg & thigh, which eventuated in verioous enlargements of the veins of the limbs, and he is thereby not only incapacitated for Military duty, but, in the opinion of the undersigned, is one half disabled from obtaining his subsistence by manual labor. The affidavit of John Mann who states that in the fall of 1814 he belonged to the Company of Capt Memorial Forest as Ensign and was afterwards promoted to Lieutenant. He further states that he is well acquainted with Peter INGLES who is making application for a pension; that he was drafted in said company and was a Corporal in the same; that said ENGLES marched with sd. Company and performed his duty well until the Troops arrived at Malden, Upper Canada where they were stationed some time during the winter 1814 & 15. And whilst the sd. INGLES was in Malden I know that he was sick sometime, but how long he, at this time, cannot say. This affidavit further states that he was acquainted with said INGLES some time before he was drafted, as afore sd., and never heard that there was any thing the matter with his legs, but on the contrary considered him a hearty and healthy man. This affidavit further states that he has been acquainted with the said INGLES ever since he returned from the Army and from the time of his return to the present time he has heard him complain of his legs. He further states that after sd. INGLES got about whilst at Malden that he then went on and performed his duty, and after serving out his time for which he was drafted he finally received his discharge at Fort Gratiot. The Affidavit of George Fitzwaters who states that he was well acquainted with Peter INGLES who was 2nd Corporal in Capt. Memorial Forests Company attached to 16th Regiment Ky. Ma. Commanded at first by Col. A. Porter. Whilst stationed at Malden January 1814 the said Peter INGLES was taken sick and took considerable medicine. I belonged to the same mess and was with him every day and I know he was very much exposed, the weather being very cold and having but few of the necessaries required to keep us comfortable. From his being so much exposed or his being sick and taking medicine, he frequently had the Cramp very bad in his legs and other limbs. This affidavit further states that the sd. Peter INGLES attended to and performed his duty well as a soldier and that the above circumstance took place whilst he was in actual service in the Army of the U.S. I never heard the sd INGLES complain of any thing being the matter with his legs until after the time of the sickness and exposure that I have already spoken of. Also the affidavit of John W. Whitcher; this affidavit states that he was well acquainted with the applicant Peter INGLES, who is making application for a pension, before the sd. INGLES joined the army & that this affiant never knew him to complain of his legs being sore or troubled any with the cramp in his legs. But when he returned home he complained very much with his legs, particularly with one of them, and he stated that from exposure and taking a great deal of medicine whilst at Malden had been the cause of the soreness of his legs. Peter ENGELS' Pension Application from Arkansas

Some time in the year 1814 I got acquainted with Peter ENGLES at New-Port, State of Kentucky where Col. Porter's Regiment rendezvoused. I hired as a substitute to march to Maulden in Canada. We lay some days at New-Port and while we lay there Mr. ENGLES was elected corporal. I joined the mess with him when on duty. I knew him to be as active and stout as almost any man in the Regiment. I never knew him to shrink from duty, only when sick. When we got to Fort Maulden, the weather became very cold, and we were very much exposed to the cold. Fort Maulden had been burnt by the British, and we were obliged to be in our tents untill we could build it again, and that was late in the season. Some time before the Fort was finished, Corporal ENGLES was taken sick, and was not fit for duty. The orderly Sargent put him on the sick list with a great many more of our men, and ordered them to go to Sargent Timberlake's office. (I went with the men but was not sick myself) for examination. The Doctor would not let Corporal ENGLES go to the hospital, but gave him a dose of Tarter. I returned with(him) to quarters. Corporal ENGLES then took his medicine. He got myself and I think George Fitzwaters to wait on him. The medicine had not long operated untill he was thrown into a powerful sweat. He had to step out a few rods. I think the second time he went out we were obliged to help him into the tent. He was taken with a cramp and in a few minutes he was speechless. A man by the name of George Harter and myself rubed him with blankets till the cramp left him. He took the cramp the second time, and we rubed him again. When he got so he could talk to us, he said there was something the matter with his leg. We took off his pantaloons and found that a vein had broke out of his thy, and in a few minutes it got down to the calf of his leg and ankle. It was not long till Capt. Forester's company, to which we belonged, with Captain Bacon's company was ordered to Fort Grashot on Lake Huron. Corporal ENGLES could scarcely get along. We had to help him most of the way. We remained there untill we were discharged, which was the 15th day of March A.D. 1815. He still complained much with his leg. We travelled together until we got to Cincinnati, Ohio. There we parted. I did not see him again for eight or ten years. He then complained of his leg being a great trouble to him. He showed it to me and it still looked bad. I did not see him again untill I saw him in Batesville, Arkansas.

The Committee on Pensions, to whom were referred the documents relating to the claim of Peter Engles, senior, for a pension, report:

That the views of the Committee on Pensions at the last session of Congress on this case, are adopted by this committee, and made a part of their report, in the following words:

"That the claimant was a soldier in the last war with Great Britain; that, while stationed at Fort Malden, in Upper Canada, he was taken sick, and while under the operation of medicine was seized with violent cramps in his lower extremities, which returned upon him at times, and resulted in a total disqualification for military duty. It appears by the testimony, that he was a hale and healthy man before he entered the service, and that since his discharge he has never had the free use of his lower extremities. The committee are satisfied that the petitioner's disability was superinduced by his exposure at an inclement season while in the discharge of his duty as a soldier, and is sufficient to entitle him to the highest rate of pension. They, therefore, report a bill for his relief."



JOHN INGRAM. The earliest evidence of the history of this illustrious family is obtained from family annals, kept from generation to generation and handed down from father to son. About the year 1680 Sir Nedom Ingram appears as a prominent citizen of Worcestershire, England. He was pre Scotch blood, and belonged to that sturdy old and honored historical religious sect called: "The Waldenses" An active advocate of the Protestant reformation, he was among those who (at that time) courageously encouraged both in word and deed, the dissemination of that light which was first manifested under: "Crammer's" preaching, he who has been aptly styled "The Morning Star of the Reformation."

Sir Nedom INGRAM, it seems was married twice, and had four sons, two by his first wife, Emanuel and Joseph Ingram, and by his second wife, Nedom and Thomas Ingram. At a later day, about the beginning of the seventeenth century Joseph and Thomas emigrated to the colony of North Carolina, in North America, settling first near Raleigh. Joseph Ingram is reported as marrying a Miss Rains and had several children, among whom were two boys named Nedom and Shadrach Ingram. In time both married and Shadrach Ingram had four children: Nedom, Joseph and Shadrach, and one girl, Elizabeth Ingram. Shadrach Ingram, who was the grandfather of John Ingram, the subject of this sketch, was born in Edgecombe Co., N.C. about the year 1767, and married Miss Elizabeth DeLoche, who was also born in the same county in the year 1765.

Her ancestors emigrated from France about the year 1590, to escape Catholic persecution, and settled in the colony of Virginia. After Shadrach Ingram's marriage, he settled down to farming with slave labor in that county, his good old father having left him, and all his other children a moderate competency. Soon after the beginning of the present century, he moved to the Territory of Tennessee, and located near Lebanon, in Wilson County, where he continued farming on an extensive scale for that day and time. He served faithfully through the War of 1812 against Great Britain. Some time between 1830 and 1834, he (Shadrach Ingram), like many other good hearted, but unfortunate men, became the security of a friend, and the result was financial ruin. All his little fortune was swept away, leaving him and his family almost homeless and penniless. Soon after, leaving Wilson Co., TN., he moved to Washington Co., AR., in 1836 or 1837, where he again opened a farm and did the best he could, though in the latter years of his life he and his good wife were cared for by their youngest son, Shadrach Ingram, Jr., until their death, which occurred between the years 1855 and 1859. A true and noble man, sincere and honest, none ever lived who lived his wife and children more devotedly and affectionately. Although his ancestors were Scotch and he was a native American, his love for the old land, as well as an ardent and devoted advocacy of educational and religious training, were among the most prominent traits of his character. He had eight children, four boys and four girls. All of them are now deceased, except three: Shadrach; Dilly (Sherry) and Will Ingram (the father of John Ingram). William Ingram was born near Lebanon, Tenn., March 15, 1815, and remained with his father until seventeen years of age, when he went to the State of Illinois, near Carrollton, where in his eighteenth year, he became a member of the Church (Old School Baptist).

There he also met and married Miss Elizabeth A. Pearson, of Puritan stock, 6 March 1833. She was born 17 April 1817, in Gibson Co., Ind. Early in September following their union they started for the Territory of Arkansas, arriving at Fayetteville in October and settling near that (then) small village, where Mr. Ingram commenced farming and preaching. Arkansas was then a wild and dreary wilderness, and when he went out to preach he could do no better than some of his earliest predecessors, go out without scrip or purse, because wild meat and hone were plenty, and both proved an acceptable diet in those days. On the night of 10 November 1833 Mr. Ingram and wife went out on the mountain (four miles from town) to sit up with old Uncle Johnnie Miller, who was quite ill, some eight or ten persons also being present. During their night watch and about 2 o'clock A.M. on the morning of the 11th, the whole heavens were singularly a light by an immense blaze, which, upon discovery, was found to proceed from a great meteoric shower; this occasion of "the falling stars" has ever been a matter of historical comment.

In their extreme anxiety many kneeled and prayed to God to preserve them from a burning world, though others, and the more curious watched the proceeding until its close. Rev. Mr. Ingram and his wife are both living and well, still residing near Fayetteville, at the age of seventy-four. He is as regular in his devotions to the ministry and the service of his divine Master, as he was in starting out fifty-five or fifty-six years ago, and indeed more so, the trust which he once had having been found by experience to be, the only sure dependence the beauty of which increases with years. Mr. and Mrs. Ingram are the parents of seven children, four boys and three girls: Mrs. Mary Davis (the eldest, living in Washington Co.; John (subject of this

memoir, in Little Rock, Miss Elizabeth A. (died in 1864), Jones P. (a successful farmer near Waveland, in Yell County), Miss Irene (lives with her respected father and mother).

Sandy O. Ingram (also a farmer in Washington County, and Albert J. Ingram (the youngest). The parents reside on the family homestead, and Albert J. is a successful farmer, well-to-do, and it is under his roof that the old people (his parents) and his youngest sister find a home of cheerful welcome, loving care, and all the needed comforts in their declining years. His father, now seventy-four years old, whose ministry runs back to his eighteenth or nineteenth year, is one whose life had been well spent, like Samuel of old, a servant of the most high God. Not only may he look back upon a life well spent in his efforts to call others to repentance, but he can and does sincerely enjoy the proudest heritage of all mankind, that of knowing his ancestors; for several centuries back have been prominent in supplying servants and soldiers for the Cross of Christ. John Ingram, son of Rev. William Ingram, was born near Fayetteville, Ark., 3 May 1836. He remained with his father on the farm and attended the schools of the county, until about fifteen years old, after which he was employed in the circuit clerks office, under Presley R. Smith, who was a native of Fayetteville, TN. Remaining there and also attending school at the Arkansas College (then under the superintendence of Rev. Robert Graham, President) for some time, he subsequently taught a country school about one year, and at the end of that period was tendered and accepted a clerkship in a large and extensive wholesale and retail dry goods and grocery house of Wallace Ward & Co. At the time of this offer to him, the firm name was Ward & Southmayd, Van Buren, Ark. The year 1861 still found him at this place but he soon left it to enter service of his native state (Arkansas), in the great contest for constitutional liberty. In eight or ten months the troops were transferred to the Confederate cause, which cause he served faithfully until the last of May 1865, when he was paroled with others by Gen. Canby. He arrived here in June 1865, and has made his place of residence ever since. Soon after his arrival Mr. Ingram married to Mrs. E. A. Broughton (formerly Miss Calhoun), who had one child, Mollie Broughton, the later married Col. A. S. Fowler, a prominent citizen and highly cultured gentleman of this city, who is doing a most extensive and profitable life insurance business. Mr/ Ingram has 3 children: Sue Ayliff; Charles Calhoun; and Carrie Eugenia Ingram.

DEATH OF AN OLD CITIZEN - Rev. Wm. Ingram - 1898

The Rev. Wm. Ingram, one of Washington county's oldest and best citizens, died at his home near Greenland on Sunday night, 30 Oct. 1898, and was laid to rest in the family burying ground, near Moses Tharp's on the 31st of Oct., Rev. J. R. Loving of the Regular Church officiating.

Uncle "Billy" Ingram, as he was familiarly called by his many friends, deserves a page in the history of Washington county, in which he had lived for sixty five years as an honest, law-abiding, industrious citizen, and which he found a wild forest, only recently the hunting ground of the Indian and which, by energy and industry, was soon converted into fruitful fields.

Mr. Ingram was a descendant of an English family who came to America in early colonial days. His ancestors were true patriots and brave soldiers during the Revolutionary War. He was born in Wilson Co., Tenn., 16 April 1815, and in early boyhood went to the new state of Illinois where, at the age of 18 years, he was married to Miss Elizabeth Ann Pearson, who was just 17 years of age. They were married in Fulton Co., Illinois, on the 6th of March 1833, by Wm. D. Putman, a justice of the peace. On the 10th of the following September this newly married couple started on the long journey for the newly settled country of Washington county, Ark., and reached the little village of Fayetteville on the 19th of October, 1833, and built their first home five miles south of town where, in Feb. 1835 their first child was born, -- daughter, (Marcy Ann)--now Mrs. Davis, living at West Fork. Here was also born their first son, John Ingram, now a prominent businessman in Little Rock. Other children were born to them who are now dead, but Sandy Ingram, their fifth child, is one of Washington county's most respected citizens, whose home is near Woolsey, this county.

Jones Ingram of Yell county is a son of the deceased.

His son Andrew lives at the old homestead, and he took good care of his venerable father during his declining years, and during his last illness he received the kindest attention of his children.

He made a profession of religion at the age of 18, attached himself to the Regular Baptist Church and was an earnest, zealous worker in that church until the year 1839, when feeling called to more active duties in the church he began his public ministry, exhorting his fellow men to live for God, honor and glory.

He was one of the original members of the first Baptist church organized in Washington county and at the same time of his death was the oldest member of that church in this part of the state, except Mrs. Sarah Chapman who lives near the home of the deceased. In 1848, at the association held on Lee's Creek in Crawford county, he was regularly ordained as a licensed minister of the gospel and was a co-laborer in the church with those old worthies--Revs. John Holcomb, Thos. W. Brinson, Thomas Dodson, and James Mayfield, all of whom preceded him to that land of rest, where the old "pioneer preacher" has found them awaiting his coming to join in their Heavenly songs of praise.

Only a few months ago I was present at the funeral of his old friend and neighbor, Stephen Pearson, and heard him talk at the grave--assuring those present that he was ready for the Master's call and that death had no terrors for him.

On the first Sunday in October he was attending the Baptist association held at Wheeler, this county, and returned to his home on the 4th of October was taken down sick on the 10th and died on the 30th. During his illness, which lasted 20 days, he often told his family and friends that he never had enjoyed one of their associations as much as the one just closed, saying that there was so much good preaching, and good fellowship exhibited among Christians of all denominations that it seemed like heaven begun on earth. His life has been an open book. No one doubted his honesty and integrity. As a neighbor he was kind and obliging, as a friend true and faithful, as a citizen active in the discharge of every duty and I daresay that no man ever had just cause of complaint against him during the 65 years that he had lived in Washington county.

In politics he was as honest in his belief as he was in his religious views and never was afraid to speak his honest sentiments. He was proud to be known as a Jackson Democrat.

There are but very few men yet living in our county who were here when Uncle Billy Ingram, with his young bride of 17 summers, moved into their log cabin in the wilderness in 1833. They lived happily together for 61 years. His wife died about four years ago and his wornout body was laid beside her, there to sleep until the resurrection morn. This noble, generous-hearted old pioneer will greet his friends no more in his hospitable home on earth but his many friends will cherish his memory, and his good deeds will live after him.

Dr Brother

Your letter rec's & glad to hear from you. For the past 3 years I have been afflicted with "Inflammatory rheumatism" in my right foot & leg so seriously that I am unable to get around much of the time & will be wholly unable to attend fathers funeral if it was to occur in 5 miles of this town I couldn't attend it, my foot is twisted so I can't walk on it to do any good I am so mortified & hurt that I was not able to go & see father & mother during their illness & deaths, or even attend his or mothers funeral that I am greatly prostrated over it, I did want to see you all before I die, but it seems that I am to be denied that blessing in this life because now I am beyond going about to see anyone Sue and Carrie are both in poor health also Carrie.....as Mr. Wishendorff... (cant read) and I pray god to bless you at the church at.... & all others...hoping to hear from you again after the meeting with my love to all of our family I am truly your brother

Dr. George Emmett Cannon of Hope Leaves His Imprint
On the Path of Progress Wherever He Goes

Down in Southwest Arkansas an elderly physician and surgeon, known and loved by thousands throughout the region, still is strong and active at eighty. He is busily engaged in practicing medicine while applying his philosophy of life, "The measure of a man's life is the well spending of it, and not the length," as set forth by Plutarch.

The doctor, George Emmet Cannon, is busy from morning until night in his office, seeing patients or operating in the hospital he founded and has owned for 30 years.

"With the help of the Great Physician, I hope to be able and active, and helping the sick and afflicted for many more years," he prays.

Dr. Cannon's practice extends through the days of horseback visits, log trains, and buggies, from the turn of the century down to the present days of rapid communications and transportation. He has run the whole way from country doctor, saw-mill surgeon, and small town practitioner to his present place as an outstanding diagnostician and surgeon.

When Dr. Cannon moved to Hope to begin his practice of medicine in 1910 he brought with him an automobile, one of the first half dozen in the country.

"I have pushed automobiles more miles in this section of Arkansas, than many people have driven them," he said. "There were no roads that could be called roads, just a right of way and a wagon track. In wet weather the mud was deep, in dry weather many roads were impassable as sand was deep. When we finally got cars as good as model T's, I used to keep two or three, so that I could keep one running. My patients were scattered all over Hempstead county."

Dr. Cannon was born April 3, 1870, four miles north of Ozan, Hempstead County. His parents were The Rev. Ben. F. Cannon, early day Baptist preacher and Mary Ann (Robbins) Cannon. His father came from Tennessee in the early 1840'. His mother, a native of Hempstead County and daughter of Sam Robbins, died when he was six years old, leaving six children. His father remarried, having eight more children. Unable to educate this great number his father tried to dissuade Dr. Cannon from going to college. With that aggressiveness which remains a characteristic of his today, he made crops, taught school, and cleared land to pay his own way.

No person ever questioned that he has been and will always be, a man of his word. One year he came home from college with \$11. He applied for a school teaching position for the three months, telling the school board, "I will teach for \$35. a month.

The board explicitly stated, "We will give you \$100. for teaching the three months."

"Well," he said, "I just won't teach. I will do something else." He got a job for \$12.50 a month, with board and room in addition.

He met Miss Josephine Lile, who lived near Waldo, Columbia County, while both were attending Ouachita College. They were married in 1897, after she received her BS degree from Central College, Conway. They have four children, one son and three daughters, 13 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

A real companion, indeed, is Mrs. Cannon. She went to school with him in his last year of medical school. Only once has she failed to go with him when for post-graduate work or for regional meetings of the American Medical Association. They are looking forward to driving to San Francisco in June to the AMA.

The doctor graduated from Ouachita College in 1895 with a BS degree. He received his MD degree from University of Louisville, KY., Medical

Medical School in 1898. He has done post-graduate 25 times in Philadelphia, Chicago, Mayo's Clinic in Rochester, Boston and New Orleans. He was one of the first Arkansans to be made a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. This convocation was in Boston in 1922. In 1948 he received a Certificate of Appreciation, recognizing his more than 50 years service. He was given the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws by Ouachita College in 1949.

Dr. Cannon said, "The greatest teaching I have ever had, probably was at the hands of such men as Dr. John B. Deaver, Dr. Joseph Price, and Dr. Ernest LaPlace; all of Philadelphia. Dr. LaPlace was a close friend of Louis Pasteur. He administered the first Pasteur treatment for rabies ever given to a human.

Pasteur was a biological chemist and not a doctor of medicine; hence, could not administer the treatment himself."

After graduation from medical college Dr. Cannon spent nine years as lumber company surgeon, for a small mill in Union County, and for mills at Jonesboro and Rochele, La. Later he practiced three years in Magnolia before moving to Hope.

Dr. Cannon has the utmost contempt for anything superficially done. To him, anything worth doing is worth doing well. He has gained quite a reputation as a builder. He always considers human safety and convenience, as well as durability. When he lived in Jonesboro, La., 1903, he organized a bank, and built the first brick building in the parish. The bank's statement showed a deposit of nearly three million dollars in 1949.

In 1909 he was chairman of the building committee for the Central Baptist in Magnolia. True to form this is a substantial building. However, since the congregation has outgrown it, a new building is now in process of construction.

Included in the eight brick-buildings which he has built in Hope is the Josephine Hospital, Mrs. Cannon's namesake. This hospital, founded in May 1915 was one of the first private hospitals in the state to be accredited. It was sold to Drs. Jim McKenzie in July 1946.

In 1948, Dr. and Mrs. Cannon built and gave to Ouachita College, a modern infirmary and hospital building.

The ground-breaking ceremony was held Nov. 1947, for the Hempstead County Library, which the Cannons built and gave to the city of Hope. It is a steel, concrete, and brick structure, modern, fireproof and large enough for the city for years to come. It is situated on a beautiful quarter block of ground at Fifth and Elm Streets.

N. P. Neal donated the brick.

The contractor B. W. Edwards, and the architect, D. F. Weaver contributed their services.

The Cannons are counted among the valued members of the First Baptist Church of Hope. They have served in various capacities. Dr. Cannon has taught the Service Class, a group of about 50 men, for 25 years.

It was his class which prompted him to write his book, "Nights With Christ." His dedication of it to his constant companion, his wife, shows his love, and consideration of her. In all the many things they do there is perfect companionship, even though they are direct opposites, yet equally keen in mind. She is the dainty, vivacious type, with scintillating black eyes. He is six feet tall, blond, and weighs over 200 pounds. He is usually rushed, but he always gives the patient at hand his undivided attention, and does everything in his power to dispel fear and pain. The tenderness and love with which this big, strong man handles his patients touches the heartstrings.

With all his duties he finds time to fish and hunt. He will spend half a day at a time, fly fishing or casting, or sitting patiently in a duck blind.

As the writer sat, talking with the doctor in his spacious home, the mementoes of years of happy living seemed to beckon, "Come and enjoy me."

He reminisced on all of the old families, and the progress of the town. He revealed that he had chosen medicine for his profession, because in it he could best serve mankind."

As he remarked, "The proof of the truth of the Bible lies in the lives of those who abide by it."

The thought went home; The fulness of this doctor's christian life will hover over Hempstead County, like a hand raised in benediction, as long as time shall last.

Mrs. Thelma Wood Jones, Rt. 3 - Box 192, Stephenville, TX 76401 - Another week has gone by much too quickly, plus several more, since I first received my AFH!! I have thoroughly enjoyed reading everyone's Queries, and as I write this I wish mine would seem that easy!

My maternal grandparents were William Anderson BAILEY and Rebecca Adaline WEBB, both, b. at Ozan, Hempstead Co., AR. He was born 5 March 1864, & she was born 18 June 1866. My great grandparents, Thomas A. Bailey (Obituary had J.) born 29 Dec. 1829, died 13 Feb. 1888. He married to Alpha Augusta

TURNER, 25 Dec. 1849, in GA, where they were both born and raised (would surely like to know the county, etc.) I do not have birth or death dates on her. Her sisters were: Betsy Ann TURNER; and Sally TURNER. Betsy Ann m. a Mr. HARRIS and Sally married Sam ROBBINS. These three families (may have been more) but these three are all my elderly cousins (I ever knew about), left Dalton GA., for Texas. The undeveloped Texas did not come up to their expectation, and after a year of hardships they started back to Georgia, & arrived in Ozan, Hempstead Co., Arkansas, the year of 1859, and never made it back to Georgia! The BAILEYS had four children before they arrived in Arkansas: Mary, b. 11 Nov. 1850, Dalton, GA.; Nancy, b. ca. 1852?; Martha Jane, b. 7 Jan. 1854, Macon, GA.; Sally, b. 6 Jan. 1856, Dalton, GA. The children, b. in Arkansas: Thomas Spriggs, b. 2 ? 1860; William Anderson (my grandfather) b. 5 March 1864; Henry Harrison, b. 5 April 1866; M. Franklin, b. ? & died ca 1941; Alpha Augusta, b. 3 March 1872.

Mary married John M. BALL ca 1874; Nancy married Joel CITY?; Martha Jane married S. L. SMITH; Alpha Augusta married Jim TAYLOR; and Sally married to Oliver WOOD.

The HARRIS Family had a son, Jack HARRIS (who was in politics in the last part of the century); a daughter married Olonzo LOVELACE & their children: Bertrum; Millie; Myrtle & Claude. In 1967 some of these descendants were still living near Ozan and/or Nashville, Howard Co., AR.

Rebecca A. WEBB BAILEY's parents were: Christopher Columbus WEBB and Harriet Malinda TAYLOR. He was born in Roane County, East Tenn., 18 August 1834. She was born in Mississippi (but date unknown) and they were married in Arkansas in 1859. He parents were William & Nancy TAYLOR, b. in Tenn.? & Miss.? (would like to know the counties) came to Hempstead Co., AR 1856, and she passed away two years later. C. C. WEBB's parents were Allen & Rebecca WEBB, b. in Wilkes Co., N.C. & Morgan Co., TN. They came to Hempstead Co., AR in 1857.

I will gladly share with other working on any of these families. I am especially interested in any inf. on the BAILEY & TURNER Families from GA. or Arkansas. Also the WEBB Family from Tenn. & N.C. & Arkansas. Who was Rebecca WEBB, from Morgan Co., Tenn.? And William & Nancy TAYLOR?? I find many many William TAYLORS - this one is supposed to be the Zachary TAYLOR lineage, and "Zac" was the third of nine children, five boys and four girls. As yet, I haven't found the names of his four brothers!!! (One writer calls the "Taylors" unpretentious bunch of people). Please help!

MRS. L. C. HALL DEAD

Mrs. Lewis Christian Hall, aged 80 years, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. L. E.
Love, on South Third Street at 10 o'clock Monday night.

The funeral service, conducted by Dr. Chas. W. Anderson and Rev. Chas. F. Wilkins, was
held in the Presbyterian Church at 10 o'clock Wednesday morning, interment being in Brearly
Cemetery. Honorary pallbearers were: J. J. Jackson, Thos. A. Johnston, W. R. Hayden, W. B.
Lemoyne, Rev. S. S. Key, Robert Berry and Judge R. E. Wilson. Active pallbearers were: Dr.
W. D. Jacoway, Hazen Kimball, S. G. Catlett, Howard Hunt, M. D. Howell, J. M. Nolen, J. F.
Stevenson and Geo. F. Upton.

Mrs. Hall was born in Alabama, but at the age of one year moved with her parents, Mr.
and Mrs. Richard Hunter, to Milledgeville, GA. There she made her home until 1889, when on
Dec. 27th of that year, sh was married to Judge Lewis C. Hall and came to this city, where
she resided until her death.

Mrs. Hall was many times President of the local Chapter of the United Daughters of the
Confederacy, which she organized. She also served as State President and National Vice
President of this organization. She organized the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Presbyterian
Church and was an active member until a short time before her death. When a young girl,
she united with the Presbyterian Church, and was a loyal and faithful member until her

death.

Mrs. Hall was a woman of rare culture and refinement, devoted to her family, her church and her friends, and exemplifying in her daily life and her contact with her fellows all that was noble and true and elevating of the Old South. Her death, though not unexpected, brings a deep pang of regret to all who knew her, and especially to those of our older citizens who knew and loved and appreciated her in her more active years.

Mrs. Hall is survived by three daughters, Mrs. L. E. Love, and Mrs. A. N. Bohlinger, of this city, and Mrs. W. L. Fowlkes of Los Angeles, Calif.; two sons, Mr. A. W. Hall, of Little Rock, and Mr. C. E. Hall, of Dardanelle; eleven grandchildren and three great grandchildren; also three brothers, Messers, Richard and Hansell Hunter of Savannah, GA., and Mr. Charles Hunter of Oakland, Calif.

FINAL SUMMONS COMES TO JUDGE L. C. HALL (no date given) 1928?

Judge L. C. Hall, aged 89 years, for half a century prominently identified with the bar of this section of the State, and for years U. S. Commissioner here, died at his home on Fifth Street at 9:00 o'clock Tuesday night.

The funeral service, with Masonic honors, will be conducted this afternoon by Dr. Chas. W. Anderson, of the Presbyterian Church, assisted by Rev. Chas. F. Wilkins, of the Baptist Church, and Rev. Sam B. Wiggins, of the Methodist Church.

Judge Hall was a native of Randers, Denmark, where he was born in June 1839. He came to America when 24 years of age, and promptly identified himself with all that he found good in our system of government. He has always been actively interested in civic and educational affairs and served several terms as Mayor of Dardanelle and many terms as President of the Dardanelle School Board.

In 1886 Judge Hall was united in marriage to Miss Lavonia Watson in Cincinnati, Ohio. To this union six children were born, five of whom survive: A. W. Hall, Mrs. W. L. Fowlkes and Mrs. A. N. Bohlinger, of Little Rock, and Mrs. L. F. Love and C. E. Hall, of this city. Judge Hall's first wife passed away in 1885.

In 1887, in Milledgeville, GA., Judge Hall was united in marriage to Miss Mary Hunter, who survives him.

Lacking dates and data, the Post Dispatch cannot at this time give a proper resume of the life and labors of this venerable citizen, whose activities have done much for his community and State, but such a notice will appear later.

The Post Dispatch joins the friends of the family in extending sympathy in their bereavement.

From: Eileen Lasiter Poss, Rt. 2, Box 76, Cabot, Arkansas 72023. "This Cemetery dates from 1855 and is still in use. My family is descended from #70, John Glover. He came from Northampton County, North Carolina with his children to Madison Co., Tenn., in 1846. Then the family moved to Prairie Co. (later Lonoke Co.) Arkansas in 1852. He was the father of 20 children and had four wives, not all at the same time. I am making a booklet of Family Group Sheets on John GLOVER and some of his children. If anyone is interested, they can contact me for a copy. The GLOVER FAMILY has an annual reunion the third Sunday in September in Lonoke County at Mt. Zion United Methodist Church. The booklet on Glover will be presented at this reunion. Everyone interested in GLOVER or PARKER or other related families is welcome. John GLOVER'S 1st wife was Elizabeth PARKER of Northampton Co., North Carolina. My cousin, Ruby Gagliana, of Lonoke has a lot of information to share at the reunion on the PARKERS. She has traced them back to England several generations.

Mt. Zion United Methodist Church where the reunion is held has quite a history also. Only this year a charge conference book was discovered which revealed the date Mt. Zion was organized, 15 February 1867. It was called Pleasant Grove until 1872 when a church building was constructed and named Mt. Zion. Several of John GLOVER'S children were prominent members of the church. This record book and membership roll books of Mt. Zion are on microfilm at the Arkansas History Commission, in Little Rock.

My ancestor chart is really something because I have so many people on both sides who were related. John GLOVER and Elizabeth PARKER are my great great grandparents 3 times. It is all really fascinating to me. Wish I had more time to spend on genealogy.

From records in Rutherford Co., N. C. he also had a son named John.

Hancock Co., Court Docket appealed to High Court of Errors and Appeals, Miss. "Elias WALLIS, et al vs. David WINDGATE, Admin. of Estate of Jordan MORGAN, deceased" we find that Jordan MORGAN was the son of John MORGAN who was a brother of Elias MORGAN.

Also from court records of Rutherford Co., N.C. Elias MORGAN received a land grant March 2, 1775, on Little Mountain Creek of Broad River, Rutherford Co., N.C. Other records of deeds, this one earliest record on Elias MORGAN in Rutherford Co., NC.

This is also the earliest record I find of Elias MORGAN. There are others found in N.C. by this name. My research primarily on BILBO and WALLIS/WALLACE.

Court records of Rutherford Co., N.C. published in Book. I have copy of the original records but they are almost impossible to read.

Another Court record, Rutherford Co., NC, Martha MORGAN, widow of John MORGAN appts. attorney 1797 to recover sums in suit in Henry Co., VA., which could be a lead back to Virginia for MORGANS. Additional information will be appreciated by Mrs. Ray.

William Bolden DAVIS married Sarah Caroline YOUNG, May 1867, by Judge
Joseph Stokes, JP of Polk Co., AR.

Sarah Caroline YOUNG, was the dau. of George YOUNG, a Cherokee? & Martha
ROLLS, a Cherokee?, either George YOUNG or Martha ROLLS was a grandchild of
Johnny THOMPSON, a full blood Cherokee from Mississippi. Martha ROLLS was
called "Granny FITZGERALD" and was a midwife in Howard and Sevier Counties
in Arkansas.

William B. and Sarah Caroline's children were: Martha Jane, b. 1868;
Rebecca Alice, b. 1869; Andrew Michigan, b. 1870; India (Indiana), b. 1871;
William Fletcher, Sr., b. 26 July 1881; Daisy; Arkansas; Augusta, b. ? but
died 1932.

William Fletcher DAVIS, was school teacher at Roy, Pike Co., AR or
Stanley (county not known) AR in 1905/6, and on 19 Nov. 1906 a woman (17
years of age) single named B. P. STEUART gave birth our of wedlock to a
son she named Harrold Lee (STEUART) (DAVIS), born in Nashville, Howard Co.,
AR, and so far we have been unable to get a birth certificate for him since
he always went by the name of Harold Lee DAVIS, and AR has no record of his
birth by DAVIS, I am now trying under the name of Harold Lee STEUART. Mr.
DAVIS took the child to Daisy, Pike Co., AR where his sister, Augusta DAVIS
reared the child until Mr. DAVIS moved to Oklahoma in 1915 or 16. On 2 Jan.
1907 Miss STEUART married a man named WHITE, they lived in Stanley, AR and
in 1913 she gave birth to a girl, she named SNOW WHITE.

Miss B. P. STEUART had a brother Tom who lived at Highland, Pike Co., AR;
Bob lived in Oklahoma; Luther lived at Murfreesboro, Pike Co., AR; Adel
married (?) and lived at P&NW Junction?; John K. a Private in Company "B"
2nd Infantry, Fort Shaftner, H. T. in 1915, under Capt. Charles I. McKain.

In 1916, B. P. STEUART lived in Stanley, AR and in a letter to William
Fletcher DAVIS, SR., she talked about a brother, Joe who lived with Tom at
Highland and became the next sheriff of "our town", this was the 3rd time
he ran and won.

The STEUARTS we were told were either Choctaws or Cherokees. We were told
the DAVIS Family were Cherokee although some deny this.

Harold Lee (STEUART) (DAVIS) was my father and even though my father was
born out of wedlock, I would like to find his people and see if I am indeed
of Indian descent. I will appreciate any information or address of anyone
with knowledge or suggestion as to how I can further my research. Please
help!

EAST Kansas 66502 - I am searching for a confirmed record of the
birth of my grandmother. Her maiden name was Hester Beatrice
JONES, and was born in Charlesto, Franklin Co., AR on 17 Nov. 1895. Her
parents were Dr. William E. JONES and Annie Phoebe (EAST) JONES.

GAULT. His family is said to still live in Ark. William and Sarah's 7th
child: John Calvin BROOKS, b. 1875, Ark. married Mary Bell WISEMAN, b. 1878,
Izard Co., AR. Her parents were Thomas H. WISEMAN, b. 1821, TN., and Mary
Polly ISENHOWER, b. 1830, MO.

The town of WISEMAN, Izard County, Arkansas, is named after John William
WISEMAN, who was postmaster there for years. Any additional inf. on these
families or the areas where they lived will be appreciated.

great grandmother, Vilulie (Lula) Elizabeth CALDWELL, b. 1875

She married Newton Allen CLEMENTS, b. 1872, Ala. They were married in
Washington, Hempstead Co., AR., on 6 Sept. 1891 and later moved to Canton,
TX. Will appreciate any help and will gladly share data with others work-
