

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President's Page

Serving as President for this organization is a series of thrills because there are such splendid helpers available. Like most service organizations, we could use more "handy helpers." There are numerous projects which could be undertaken, and which would benefit us all if someone could give time to them. If you can give some time, let it be known.

To keep our publications on schedule, I am having to write this prior to the Fall Seminar. At this date, our pre-registration is lower than ordinary. We cannot readily decide upon the cause for that. Let's get those Bible records photocopied, especially. This is a free service provided by the Arkansas History Commission, and it will *not* damage the original. These are records for which there is no substitute whatever, and they are immensely valuable.

1987 is our 25th Anniversary Year for AGS! We want to make it a special one. The *Newsletter* contains some ideas we have discussed in that direction. Choices will be made in the November meeting of the Board and these will be implemented. The year will be more noteworthy if we accomplish a number of good things, no one of which appears particularly great, than if we accomplish one big attention-getting project. However, we may can blend the two. We would like to accomplish a sizeable project--along with several smaller, but also important, ones. Your suggestions are most welcome.

May I caution you once again concerning courtesy when corresponding with public officials? While in a courthouse a few days ago, I overheard a clerk and her deputies reading to each other a letter they had received from a distant state. The letter virtually demanded that certain information which would require considerable time to gather be sent, and cautioned the official against the possibility of forwarding the letter to "*a professional who charges \$... an hour.*" The letter was resented, and I am certain that the response was not what was desired. County officials most often cannot research for anybody, and certainly will not for those who tell them how to do their jobs. "Public record" simply means the record is open and may be seen by the public. Be courteous! Let's cultivate good relations.

MORE ON AMERICAN CIVIL WAR VETERANS WHO EMIGRATED TO AUSTRALIA

"COLUMN 8's request for names of American Civil War veterans who emigrated to Australia and are buried here (October 27, 28) has uncovered an interesting trickle of tales for Roy W. Parker, historian of Sydney's American Legion Post No. 1. Among them:

MAJOR Zenas Crane Rennie, Union Army, came here as general manager of the Mutual Life Insurance Co. of New York. GPS eights still compete at the annual Head of the River Regatta for the Major Rennie trophy, which he presented in 1894.

LIVINGSTON Hopkins never rose above the rank of Private in the Union Army, but as "Hop" of the Bulletin he was recognised as one of the highest ranking cartoonists in Australia. He was never naturalised, but lived in Australia more than 40 years, grew to love the people, and died in Sydney."

"**NAMES of American Civil War veterans, who emigrated to Australia and are buried here, requested by Mr. Roy W. Parker, historian of Sydney's American Legion Post No. 1, keep coming. Among them:**

JAMES Logan, born in Ireland of Scots stock, fought for the North and came to Australia to start a new life.

COLONEL James G. Jeffries, a Virginian who served the Confederacy, arrived in Sydney in late 1883 with General Josiah Howell to take the local insurance industry by storm for the New York Life Insurance Company. Colonel Jeffries died in a fall from a cliff at Coogee the next year.

JACKSON Clarke, a native of Dundee, fought for the North, returned to Scotland, and later emigrated to the Cooma district, where he died, in his 90s, in 1934."

STILL MORE ON AMERICAN CIVIL WAR VETERANS IN AUSTRALIA

"LAST PARADE, for Mr. Roy Parker, historian of Sydney's American Legion Post No. 1, of American Civil War veterans who emigrated to Australia are are buried here (Column 8, November 22):

EDWARD Walsh, who served in the Union Navy, eventually became an officer in the Queensland State Customs Office--now that's going back a bit.

ELIZABETH Knife, who was brought up in a Delaware tavern and was a nurse in the Civil War, later married a son of the Duke of Rutland in England, and was said to have been forced by his family to begin a new life with him in Australia, under a new name--Evans. She was buried at Waverley Cemetery in 1932.

"SOME of the veterans of America's Civil War marched all the way to Australia, and Mr. Roy W. Parker wants to find them. As honorary historian of Sydney's American Legion Post No. 1, he has found the graves of 25 Civil War fighters buried in NSW (editor's note: New South Wales, a state in east central Australia). Only one was a Confederate. Eight of the old soldiers are buried in Waverley cemetery. However, Mr. Parker's latest hunt for George Wilson Edwards, the Civil War hero who once shook hands with Abraham Lincoln, has drawn a blank. Edwards died at Coogee aged 97 in August 1959, and was well-known enough to get a 20-line obituary in the Herald. No one, however, seems to know where he rests now."

"THE GHOST of a Civil War soldier came to haunt yesterday's column. We said Coogee war veteran George Wilson Scott, whose final resting place is missing, died in 1959, aged 97. That makes him a Civil War hero at three years old. In fact, he died in 1939." (editor's note: It is interesting that when they got the date right, the surname was wrong!)

YET MORE ON CIVIL WAR VETERANS WHO EMIGRATED TO AUSTRALIA

"THE GRAVE of the infamous bushranger (editor's note: bandit; highwayman) Captain Moonlight was discovered at Rookwood cemetery last week, unmarked and overgrown. Mr. Roy W. Parker found it while searching for graves of American Civil War veterans who came to Australia. Moonlight--real name Andrew Scott--was hanged in Darlinghurst in 1880, but was already a villain in the Civil War. Mr. Parker believes Moonlight made bucks selling confiscated cotton to English sea captains during General Sherman's march through Georgia."

"THE FINAL resting place of George Wilson Edwards, American Civil War veteran who shook hands with Abraham Lincoln and then moved to Coogee, has been found in a rose garden. Last week this column mentioned that Mr. Roy W. Parker's hunt for Civil War veterans who marched Down Under, and his troubles finding the grave of Edwards. This week, Mr. Parker discovered the old soldier's cremation records at the North Shore Crematorium where the ashes were scattered after Edwards' death in 1939, aged 97."

"EDMUND WILLIAMS of Darling Point tells us that his grandfather, Netterville Rutledge Davies, and his great uncle, John Joseph Davies, both fought in the American Civil War, on opposing sides. Netterville Rutledge settled in the north and fought there, while John Joseph was a Confederate man. Both born in Ireland, they subsequently settled in Perth where they are buried. Roy W. Parker, who is researching American Civil War veterans here, said he's received four calls following our items and found about 30 confirmed veterans. He thought there would be a lot around, but did not think to discover so many."

JOHN SOLOMON THOMPSON, agent and bookmaker, served in the 10TH MASSACHUSETTS VOLUNTEERS during the Civil War; was wounded in the foot during the battle of Spottsylvania Courthouse. He arrived in Melbourne 1868, eventually settling in Sydney. d/o Amelia Schwitzer, Mary Marjorie, d. 30 Jan 1897, aged 3 mos, buried in Vault Plot #172. Four grandchildren (children of Phineas) now live in Newcastle, NSW area.

Henry Solomon aka Henry Solomon Thompson

PHINEAS SOLOMON THOMPSON remained in Westfield, MA, after serving as a Capt. in the 178TH NEW YORK INFANTRY. He joined the rest of the family in Sydney in 1884 and continued in the tobacco industry. His daughter, Jesse Almyra Sheldon, apparently remarried and migrated to Sydney with spouse, 1922. She was b. 14 Jun 1860, Westfield, MA; d. 12 Jun 1942, Sydney, NSW, Australia; buried Waverley Cemetery, Sydney, Plot #174, (Death Certificate #7417); her son, Stephen Dickinson Sheldon, d. 10 Aug 1933, is buried in Plot #173, (Death Certificate #12574)

THE SOLOMON FAMILY migrated from England and settled in the area of Westfield, MA; their main occupation, cigarmaking. Phineas, John and Henry served in the Union Army during the Civil War. John, and perhaps Henry, arrived in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia in 1868 (Henry's pension papers state 1876; doubtful with his injury and its effect). The patriarch followed in 1881. It appears that Joseph migrated from England to Melbourne. The matriarch and Phineas (with his family) joined the above in 1884 in Sydney where they had moved.

LIVINGSTONE YORT HOPKINS, with his wife, Harriet, after serving in the
130TH INFANTRY of the OHIO NATIONAL GUARD, COMPANY C in the American
Civil War, arrived in Sydney 07 Feb 1883 to take up a post as
cartoonist with the *Bulletin*. Eventually, as a characterist and
satirist, Livingstone became famous as "Hop of the *Bulletin*." He
also became part owner of the publication. Hopkins donated 27
volumes of *Bulletin* material to the Mitchell Library, Sydney.

FRANK STEVENS FLINT was educated in England and France. He journeyed to America and joined the Union Army under the name of his brother-in-law, "Owen Harris." He traveled to Cowra to visit a sister, settled down, married and became a bookkeeper. He was also Cowra's first Town Clerk; a founding member of the Hospital Board; First Secretary of the Jockey Club, and First Secretary of the P.A. & H. Association of Cowra. All children except Hilton Edgar married. He served in the 5TH NEW YORK HEAVY ARTILLERY, CO. M & CO. D.

JOSEPHIN CRESP went to sea on his uncle's ship at age 11 or 12. He joined the UNION ARMY, with two shipmates, under the name of Peter Martyn. One shipmate, being more fluent in English, advised the other two to say everything he did. Three Peter Martyns joined up that day! Very shortly, he transferred to the U.S. NAVY. As a merchant sailor he arrived in Australia in 1872; remained after marriage at Horsham, Victoria. He became a farmer and eventually settled near Beerl. He served on the U.S.S. NORTH CAROLINA, U.S.S. NEW HAMPSHIRE-OM PETTIT, AND U.S.S. VERMONT.

ZENUS CRANE RENNIE served in the 49TH MASSACHUSETTS VOLUNTEER INFANTRY, CO. I. After the Civil War, Major Renne' sold the family business in Massachusetts and entered the insurance business. So successful was he that he was offered the opportunity of opening an Australian office. He arrived in Sydney in 1886. His company, the Mutual Life Insurance Company of New York, eventually built the structure now called the Colonial Life Insurance building at Martin Head & 11th Street. He also donated the Major Rennie trophy for the "*Head of the River*" Regatta.

JAMES BURNS SHAW left Scotland in 1850 and journeyed to Canada. He married there. When the Civil War began, he signed up, giving his occupation as "tailor." He eventually became a PRINCIPAL MUSICIAN, 39TH ILLINOIS INFANTRY, CO. K; 29 MICHIGAN INFANTRY, CO. K. He received a medical discharge. Suffering from bronchitis, he sought a warmer climate--first, California. Someone told him that Australia was free of bronchitis. He lived at Penrith and at Banks Town in New South Wales.

The following are announcements of books contributed to the Arkansas Genealogical Society. These books are permanently housed in the local History and Genealogy Room of the Little Rock Public Library, which currently is open only on Tuesday and Saturday of each week. The Society expresses its appreciation to the authors for their generous contributions.

MARRIAGES, WASHINGTON CO., ARK. BOOKS J, K & L, 1891-1901, published by the Washington Co. Historical Society, 118 East Dickson St., Fayetteville, AR 72701. This book is presented in the same format as two earlier marriages of this county with both an index for brides as well as grooms. There are also three pages of very early marriages - 1820 to 1836, which was compiled from the files of the Arkansas Gazette. Soft cover, velo-binding, 159 pp. priced at \$18.00 and may be ordered from the above address.

ANDREW HARRISON OF ESSEX CO., VA. by James Edward Harrison. This is an interesting and valuable study of Andrew Harrison, thought to be the immigrant, who died in Essex Co., VA, in 1718, and some of his descendants, especially the family of Andrew Harrison of Orange Co. (d. 1753) whose multitudinous progeny are scattered over the country. Andrew's siblings included William of Caroline Co. (d. 1741), Elizabeth m. Thomas Munday, and Margaret m. Gabriel Long. The compiler in this lucid and reasoned account makes a strong, admittedly circumstantial case, identifying the Andrew Harrison of this title with an Andrew Harrison of Middlesex Co., England. In the course of his story, the author covers a considerable territory that will be of interest to researchers in general and to Harrison researchers in particular. Compiled from information gathered by the authors over a period of several years, this book concerns Alexander Sago b.in France and his wife Margaret born in Holland. She is listed in the 1850 census of Philadelphia Co., PA. The family lived in PA, Illinois and came to Randolph Co., Ark. with collateral Richey, Collins, and Ulmer ancestral lines. SHILDES MOORE OF MARYLAND AND HIS DESCENDANTS FROM 1732 TO 1891. First edition published by Risdon Alexander Moore, 1891; second edition indexed and edited by Donald O. Virdin. Author traces the descendants of Shildes Moore and Blandana Risdon, his wife and their descendants from their arrival in the colonies at Baltimore, in 1732 (where Moore and a brother-in-law Risdon, engaged in the sale of gold and silver bullion), covering a period of 159 years. The second edition was printed so that the history of this rather remarkable family is available to present descendants of Elizabeth Ann Odell born Nov. 14, 1862, at Camp Point, IL. Descendants can lay claim to relatives who (1) was a friend of two presidents of the US; (2) guard to President Lincoln; (3) Gen. John C. Fremont's most trusted aid; and (4) a U. S. Senator. The loose papers detailing these court cases have never before been available to the public in any form. These records contain notes of historical interest and a tremendous amount of information of value to genealogical researchers. Contained in these papers are: birth dates, death dates, divorces, copies of wills, Bible records, estate distributions, deed copies, land disputes, multi generations of some families, and slave ownership disputes. Locations are given of Tennesseans who migrated to Alabama, Illinois, Kentucky, Mississippi, Missouri, Texas, and other Tennessee counties. MARRIAGES OF SOME AMERICAN RESIDENTS AND GUIDE TO DOCUMENTS, Volume I, compiled and published by Yates Publishing Co., P.O. Box 237, Ozark, MO 65731. This volume is mainly a reference to marriages listed on pedigree charts which have been submitted to Yates Publishing Co. and concern only marriages of persons who lived in the USA or the colonies or territories which later became states. The book contains two alphabetical lists, so that searches may be made for marriages using either the husband or wife's name. The year and state of birth are included if known. In almost every instance, additional data can be found in the documents from which the marriages have been noted, often the names of parents or children. In most cases, it will be possible to contact compilers of the charts, or you may order photocopies of documents from the publishing company. Soft-cover, 193 pp., \$8.00, order from above address.

THE SCRIMGEOUR ANCESTRAL CHART. This 23 x 35 inch ancestry chart is printed on high quality cardstock and distributed by John H. Scrimgeour. It allows you to trace nine generations of ancestors - not only by name, but also by life-span, locality, and occupation. The chart appears to be a major improvement over the "fan" or "family tree" charts in common use today. POLK COUNTY, ARKANSAS, 1890 "CENSUS" RECONSTRUCTED, compiled by Wanda Tilley, typed and printed by Gypsie Cannon. Adding to our Sesquicentennial project are the records from Polk Co., Arkansas. This county had no real estate or personal tax records for 1890, therefore, this work was taken from the 1888 Real Estate Tax book, and also includes the 1890 marriage records for this county, as well as the 1890 Delinquent Real Estate Sales. POLK CO. (ARK.) SCHOOLS AND TEACHERS FROM 1918-1925, also Land Redemptions 1919-1922. Compiled by Gypsie Cannon, this book was found in the basement ault of the Polk Co. Court House. It lists the teachers, district, salary, date and contains a map showing school districts and townships of the county. The Land Redemptions reflect nasma, date, page and location. Also included are a few photographs of teachers and schools in the area. Soft-cover, \$12.00, order from the compiler at P.O. Box 683, Mena, AR 71953.

POLK CO. (ARK.) DEATH AND SERVICE RECORDS. This book contains information found in a ledger used by a stone mason to record information for cutting tombstones. The name, birth and death date, and in some cases where the individual was from or next of kin was shown. The ledger was apparently a "catch-all" and many notes and addresses are included, including who paid for the stone and where to send the bill. The State pension records for Polk Co. Soldiers (1901-1904) contain name, action on claim, date (not always given) if claim was allowed and comments as to why it was disallowed. Ms. Cannon, the compiler, has added the 1927 phone book for Mena in its original form. Soft-cover, \$10.00, order from Gypsie Cannon, P. O. Box 683, Mena, AR 71953.

POLK COUNTY, ARKANSAS MARRIAGES 1872-1900, by Gypsie Cannon, 609 Hickory, Mena, AR 71953. A listing of the marriages recorded in this county for the years indicated, listed alphabetically, with a bride's name index. Apparently, Ms. Cannon did not copy additional information such as letters of consent, residence of bride or groom where given, etc., though copies of such records, once found in this book, may be ordered from the County Clerk. A welcome addition to the published genealogical records of this county! Soft-cover, 55 pp. \$12.00. Order from compiler.

AMERICAN STATE PAPERS, LAND GRANTS AND CLAIMS, 1789-1837, by Walter Lowrie, reprinted by Southern Historical Press, Inc., c/o The Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29641-0738. When the American State Papers were first issued between 1834 and 1860, two different editions were published, one by the Duff Green Co. Publishers, and the other, and the most widely used, was done by Gales & Seaton Publishers. Both series contained essentially the same information. Southern Historical Press has taken Volumes I and II of the Duff Green edition and has lifted out for publication those continuous sections that deal with the Land Grants and Claims for the present states of Louisiana, Mississippi and Missouri, with a full name index. Types of claims to land on Public Demain are primarily redemption rights; homestead settlements; military bounty lands and militia claims:

LAND CLAIMS IN THE EASTERN DISTRICT OF THE ORLEANS TERRITORY, Soft Cover, 160 pp. contains approx. 5,500 names, \$27.50

LAND CLAIMS IN THE MISSISSIPPI TERRITORY, Soft cover, 304 pp., contains approx. 5,000 names, \$35.00

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and land descriptions of taxable acreage are listed. A separate index of slaveholders is included showing the number of slaves owned each year. Non-resident owners and estates of deceased taxpayers are included. With the information in this index, it is possible to determine approximately when an individual moved to the Izard Co. area, when he moved away or died, the section(s) wherein he owned land, the proximity of other taxpayers with the same surname, and from the poll tax whether he was over 21 and under 609 years of age. Pre-Civil War Izard Co. included not only the Izard Co. of today, but parts of present-day Fulton, Baxter, Carroll, Marion, Stone and Van Buren Counties. Researchers will find this material invaluable. Soft-cover, 233 pp., \$19.50 postpaid, may be ordered from the compiler at the above address.

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
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
